The STOP Methodological Framework

The main modules have been divided into a list of learning outcomes based on the European Qualification Framework (EQF) guidelines, and divided into Knowledge, Skills and Attitudes.

In the context of the EQF:

- Knowledge: is described as theoretical and/or factual
- Skills: cognitive (involving the use of logical, intuitive and creative thinking) and practical (involving manual dexterity and the use of methods, materials, tools and instruments).
- Attitudes: is described in terms of responsibility and autonomy.

For the purpose of the STOP project <u>2 sets of framework</u> were developed :

✓ For Children (9-12 Years Old)

✓ For Youth (13-18 Years Old)
